Chikungunya Virus

Chikungunya (pronounced Chik-en-gun-ye) virus is spreading! It arrived on the islands of the Caribbean in 2013 and a recent ABC News report stated that it may be in Tennessee. Also, Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services confirmed a case this past week—the infected woman had traveled to Haiti.

Chikungunya virus is transmitted to people by mosquitoes. Its most common symptoms are fever and joint pain with other symptoms being headache, muscle pain, joint swelling or rash. While the disease is less lethal than West Nile virus, the joint pain is excruciating and debilitating which can last days and sometimes weeks. The virus' spread occurs via infected travelers. There's **NO WAY** to prevent or treat the virus so prevention of mosquito bites is vital, especially daytime biting mosquitoes.

Bites are best prevented by wearing insect repellent and outdoor clothing that's "long, loose and light" according to the Tennessee Health Department. Also, avoid wearing perfume; eliminate standing water; and use screens on windows and doors to keep mosquitoes out.

Do your best to avoid this or any other viruses spread by mosquitoes this summer!

CIRCLE STUDY FOR PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN **HORIZONS BIBLE STUDY 2014-2015** **"RECONCILING PAUL"**

This year's study deals with contemporary look at 2 Corinthians, and in-depth study of Paul, and the Apostle's letter to the members of the congregation of the church at Corinth. There appears to be a controversy between Paul and the Church. Corinth was a seaport town in ancient Greece. Perhaps people in seaports became more worldly by word of mouth than the inland peoples.

The study was written by Elizabeth Hinson-Hasty who is chair of the department of theology at Bellarmine University. She makes her home in Louisville, Kentucky with her family. Her credits have been: 2010 she was a Fullbright Scholar and a recipient of the Willson Wyatt Faculty Fellowship for Excellence in Teaching and Scholarship. She also was a recipient of the Kentuckiana Metroveristy Award for Instructional Development.

Assisting Professor Hinson-Hasty is Reverend Irene Pak. She is a graduate of McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago and is now serving as associate pastor at Stone Church of Willow Glenn in San Jose, CA. Reverend Pak has written "The Suggestion for Leaders" portion of the study.
