## **Cursillo – Pilgrimage – Ultreya – Renewal – 4<sup>th</sup> Day - Palanca**

Have you wondered what these strange words mean ???

**Cursillo** – Spanish word, “Short Course in Christianity”

**Ultreya** – Spanish word, onward, keep climbing, the sharing of our Christian life

**Palanca** - gifts

The Cursillo movement started in the Catholic Church in Spain in 1940 but was suppressed until 1948, after WW II. The purpose was part of an effort to prepare young men for a spiritual pilgrimage and was also intended to help overcome the aftermath of the Spanish Civil War. The first Cursillo weekend was held in Spain in 1948 and quickly spread into Latin America and the Spanish speaking areas of the USA. The first English speaking Cursillo was held in San Angelo, TX. in 1961 and spread to the Episcopal, Methodist, Lutheran and Presbyterian denominations. The Oklahoma Presbyterian Cursillo, which was conducted by and for Presbyterians, started in 1993 after Freda Jones (from the Edmond Church) attended a weekend in NC. In 2007, the name was changed to Oklahoma Presbyterian Pilgrimage, and was opened to other religious denominations.

The Pilgrimage weekend is a three day “Love Feast” --- a weekend that will not be forgotten. The retreat is centered around a series of fifteen talks presented by clergy and lay persons who serve as staff members.

Day One is focused on Liberation – set free to live a new kind of life in Christ.

Day Two is focused on Christ – lead the participant to experience the coming to life of the truth of Christianity.

Day Three is focused on the Christian Life – it seeks to give shape, strength and resiliency to Christian persons.

Day Four – focused on perseverance – It is the rest of your life

Thus – those who attend automatically become 4<sup>th</sup> Day Members.

There are 56 4<sup>th</sup> day members in the Duncan area. You can usually spot them by the sparkle in their eyes, smile on their face, and the attitude to help others.
